

# Clean Vehicle Rebate Project (CVRP) Overview of EV Incentives

#### **CVRP Rebate Amounts**



Vehicle Type	Standard Rebate	Increased Rebate
Fuel Cell Electric Vehicle (FCEV)	\$4,500	\$7,000
Battery Electric Vehicle (BEV)	\$2,000	\$4,500
Plug-in Hybrid Electric Vehicle (PHEV)	\$1,000	\$3,500
Zero-Emission Motorcycle	\$750	\$750

# **Income Eligibility**



Consumers are ineligible for a rebate if their gross annual income exceeds the following thresholds.

- \$150,000 for single filers
- \$204,000 for head-ofhousehold filers
- \$300,000 for joint filers

The caps do not apply to FCEVs.

#### **Increased Rebate**

An additional \$2,500 is available to consumers with annual household incomes less than or equal to 400 percent of the federal poverty level (FPL).

\*Updated annually. CVRP applies the update on July 1 of each year to all applications received on or after that date. For households with more than 8 persons, add \$17,920 for each additional person.

### **Vehicle Eligibility**



Applicants must fulfill the following requirements for eligibility.

• Rebates have a cap of \$60,000 base MSRP (except FCEVs).

- Eligible PHEVs must have a minimum all electric range of 30 miles in compliance with the EPA test standards (45 miles UDDS).
- Vehicle must be owned, operated and registered in California for a minimum of 30 months.
- Previously registered unwinds, rollbacks and demo vehicles are not eligible. See backside for more info.

### **Additional Incentives Available**

Additional regional and utility incentives, tax credits, HOV lane access and reduced electricity rates are available for eligible EVs.

#### **Federal Income Tax Credit**



A federal tax credit up to \$7,500 is available on the purchase of new electric vehicles. The amount varies based on the vehicle's battery size, total vehicle sales and your ability to apply the credit.

## **Carpool (HOV) Lane Access**



High occupancy vehicle lane access allows single-occupant EV drivers to use carpool lanes.

# Regional, Utility and Air District Incentives

California's regional utilities and air districts offer various incentives and rebate programs to customers for replacing old cars, installing charging stations and signing up for time-of-use rate plans.



Time-of-use rates can greatly reduce costs for charging a vehicle at home by charging during off-peak hours. **Contact your regional air district or local utility to learn more.**

## **Eligibility of Unwinds, Rollbacks and Demo Vehicles**

#### Exceptions to CVRP's new vehicle requirement

Unwind, Rollback and Unregistered Demonstration Vehicles are eligible for the rebate only if the vehicles

- Have not been previously registered
- Have an odometer reading of less than 7,500 miles at the time of purchase

No guarantees of approval should be made to customers without checking the VIN with the CVRP administrator. Additional documentation or verification might be requested before rebate approval.

#### Vehicles NOT eligible for a CVRP rebate

- · Previously registered vehicles
- Delivered or received out-of-state including online orders
- Purchased/leased and/or registered out-of-state
- Odometer reading of more than 7,500 at time of purchase
- Exceeds MSRP cap of \$60,000 (excluding FCEVs)
- PHEVs without a minimum all-electric range of 30 miles (45 miles UDDS)

#### What to do when a vehicle is returned?

If a newly sold or leased vehicle is returned to your dealership, contact CVRP staff immediately with the VIN and owner's name.
