



## Increased Rebate Levels for Low- and Moderate-Income Consumers

California consumers with household incomes less than or equal to 300 percent of the federal poverty level are eligible for an additional \$2,000.

A household includes all family members or other unrelated persons, including the rebate applicant, who reside together and share common living expenses. Gross annual household income includes that of the applicant and all other individuals in the household, ages 17 years and older, regardless of whether they are related to the rebate applicant.

Standard rebate plus \$2,000

\* Updated annually. CVRP applies the update on July 1 of that year to all applications received on or after that date.

## Income Verification

Only a portion of applicants are selected for income verification. If you are not selected, you do not need to submit proof of income. If you are selected, you must provide proof of income, and failure to do so will result in your application being cancelled and no rebate issued.

## Income Cap for Higher-Income Consumers

Consumers are not eligible for CVRP rebates if their gross annual incomes are above the thresholds listed below. The income cap applies to all eligible vehicle types except fuel-cell electric vehicles.

### Income Cap

- \$150,000 for single filers
- \$204,000 for head-of-household filers
- \$300,000 for joint filers

For a vehicle purchased on or after January 1, 2018, high-occupancy vehicle (HOV) decals cannot be combined with the CVRP rebate unless the income restrictions for tax returns fall below: \$150,000 for a single person, \$204,000 for a head-of-household and \$300,000 for a joint tax return.

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
